Any student in grades 3-12 (**Explorers (grade 3) through grade 12 - NOT CLOVERBUDS**) who is a resident of Polk County or who attends a school located in Polk County is eligible to exhibit school projects or work at the Polk County Fair in St. Croix Falls, July 29-30-31 & August 1-2.

Exhibits will be judged according to Danish system and every exhibit will be awarded a ribbon and a premium. Ribbon premiums: Blue-\$1.75 Red-\$1.50 White-\$1.25 Pink-\$1.00.

Exhibits are to be work or projects completed in school during 2008-2009 school year for a grade or extra credit. Teacher must sign entry form for 2008-2009 year work verification. You can enter only 1 item per lot number.

Exhibitors must bring exhibits to the appropriate building or conference judging at the fairgrounds in St. Croix Falls between 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, July 29. Bring to Superintendent of Entries Office to get entry tags and exhibitor admission ticket. Exhibits are to remain on display until 4:30 p.m., August 2.

The \$4.00 junior exhibitor season admission ticket admits exhibitor into the fairgrounds anytime from 6:00 p.m., Thursday to 4:30 p.m., Sunday. Entries are to be made on the green colored entry forms distributed to the schools. **ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN JUNE 12.**

OPEN DIVISION DEPARTMENT 2 - PUREBRED BEEF CATTLE

1. A JUNIOR CALF is one born on or after January 1 of exhibit year and be at least 4 months old the first day of the fair.
2. A SENIOR CALF is one born during the period September 1 to December 31 of year preceding exhibit year.
3. A SUMMER YEARLING is one born during the period May 1 to August 31 of year preceding exhibit year.
4. A JUNIOR YEARLING is one born during the period January 1 to April 30 of year preceding exhibit year.
5. A SENIOR YEARLING is one born during the period September 1 to December 31 of second year preceding exhibit year.
6. A 2-YEAR OLD and older is one born before September 1 of second year preceding exhibit year and which has calved during the past year.

CLASS A: BEEF CATTLE GROUP

1. A JUNIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 animals which are offspring of the same bull from junior calf, senior calf, and/or summer yearling bull and heifer classes, with both sexes to be represented.
2. A SENIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 animals, any age, the offspring of one sire. All shall be 2 years of age and over.
3. In GET OF SIRE classes, the name of the sire shall be designated by the exhibitor. The animals need not be owned by a single exhibitor.

Goats originating from outside Wisconsin – All goats shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. All goats must be identified with official scrapie ear tags or other official individual identification. Goats exposed to scrapie will not be allowed to enter Wisconsin.

Goats originating from Modified Accredited state (**Michigan and Minnesota**) must have a permit number and require special tuberculosis testing. Exhibitors should contact the Division of Animal Health at 608-224-4874, well in advance of the fair or exhibition, to determine their testing requirements. Animals for exhibition from Modified Accredited states are required to return directly to the state origin after exhibition.

Registration papers to be presented to superintendent before showing. Age shall be determined as of the opening date of the fair. No animals with horns can be shown unless full natural horns are standard for a specific breed.

1. An EXHIBITOR'S HERD shall consist of one doe under one year, one yearling doe, and one doe 2 years or older, all owned by the same exhibitor.
2. A SENIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 does which are the get of one sire with at least one in milk. The animals need not be owned by a single exhibitor, but all shall be in the senior age group.
3. A JUNIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 does under 2 years that have never freshened and are the get of one sire. The animals shall be owned by a single exhibitor.
4. A PRODUCE OF DAM shall consist of 2 does of any age which are the produce of one doe. Both animals shall be owned by the same exhibitor.
5. A DAM AND DAUGHTER shall consist of 1 doe of any age and its dam. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.
6. YEARLING MILKERS are under 2 years of age and in milk.
7. JUNIOR MILKERS are at least 2 years but under 3 years.
8. MATURE MILKERS are at 3 years but under 5 years of age.
9. AGED MILKERS are 5 years of age and older.

Junior & Senior Kids and Junior & Senior Yearlings shall never have freshened.

Rules Governing Exhibits

Entries must be made in name of actual owner.

Please Note: The 4-H poultry committee will provide Pullorum-Typhoid testing for exhibitors some time during the month of June. 4-H members enrolled in poultry project will be notified by mail. Other interested exhibitors should call 485-8600 to be placed on a mailing list to be notified.

All poultry and waterfowl must originate from flocks designated as U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or NPIP Affiliate flock and accompanied by a NPIP certificate or originate from a Wisconsin Tested Flock or Wisconsin Associate Flock and be accompanied by an enrollment certificate provided by the department certifying that they are a Wisconsin Tested Flock or Wisconsin Associate Flock. Sexually mature birds that do not meet these requirements may qualify with documentation of a negative test for Pullorum-typhoid (and Mycoplasma gallisepticum for turkeys) conducted within 90 days prior to arrival at the exhibition, and be individually identified with a wing band or leg band. Turkeys that are not going directly to slaughter may not be commingled with other poultry. This may be accomplished by separate housing or controlling the air flow or placement and spacing to prevent movement of M. gallisepticum from other poultry to the turkeys. The fair veterinarian should make this decision.

NOTICE: There will be no testing done at the fair, to stay in compliance with the state regulations. Please have your birds tested prior to the start of the fair. No birds will be admitted without proper documentation.

Proper precaution will be taken to guard against accident or loss, but in no case will the Fair Society be responsible for loss or accident from any cause whatsoever. It is suggested exhibitors padlock cages except on judging day. The State Department of Agriculture, or the fair or show management, reserves the right to have an approved veterinarian examine all fowl, and to exclude any fowl at any time for cause. Any exhibit excluded will be returned to the owner, or slaughtered, at the option of the attending veterinarian, or the State Department of Agriculture. If slaughtered, any return from the sale of the birds will be remitted directly to the owner.

All fowl exhibited may be subject to quarantine and slaughtered if any infectious or contagious disease is discovered among any of the fowl in the exhibit.

Exhibitors to furnish feed for birds and metal or glass containers for feed and water.

AWARDS

All awards will be made by comparison to the American Standard of Perfection. No exhibit will be given a prize unless worthy of same.

Cockerels, pullets, young males and young females are defined as birds hatched in current year. Exhibitors and visitors will positively be prohibited from handling birds other than their own without the consent of the owners. Cage rent is \$.50 cents per cage.
