Food Preservation Section

Rules: Awards will be based on pack, color, method of preservation, canning and flavor, if judge feels that jars need to be opened. Correct processing and preservation procedures must be followed, using USDA or University of Wisconsin-Extension publications available at the Polk County Extension Office (485-8600). Standard jars (no larger than 1 quart) must be used for canning and freezing.

Each jar must have a label with name of product, date processed, method of preparation (hot or cold pack). Method of processing (boiling water bath OR pressure canner) and time of processing. Remove ring from canning jar. All home canned foods must have been prepared within a one-year period prior to judging date. All jars must be properly labeled using labels provided at the back of the fair book and taped 1" from the bottom of the jar.
